Landing zone requirements

Preferred landing areas include:

- Parking lots
- Paved roads
- Unplowed fields without animals nearby
- Upwind from hazmat/fires

Minimal landing area:



(120' equals about 50 steps)

Area marking:

During the day:

Place orange cones at each corner.

At night:

Place landing lights or lit cones at each corner of the landing area.

Avoid: • Caution tape • Flares

Radio communications

Preferred radio frequency:

AIR LZ1

AIR LZ2

- Provide location/description of landing zone
- Obstructions to look for and report:
 - Trees – Cell towers
 - Poles – Buildings
 - Wires – Signs
- Surface condition (rocks/slope/hazards)
- Wind direction

The flight crew will contact you when we are **five minutes** from the scene.

Attempt to relay information through dispatch. During daytime hours, the aircraft may land without communication and use visual clues from the landing zone coordinator.
